

बिजनेसमैन को कोठी बेचने के नाम पर 6 करोड़ टगने वाले एक रिटायर्ड आईएएस समेत चार पर केस

चंडीगढ़, 15 मार्च (लूना): सैक्टर-8 की एक कोठी बेचने के नाम पर सैक्टर-35 निवासी बिजनेसमैन रजनीश अरोड़ा से करीब छह करोड़ रुपए ठगने वाले एक रिटायर्ड आईएएस समेत चार लोगों पर सैक्टर-3 पुलिस स्टेशन में धोखाधड़ी के तहत केस दर्ज कर लिया गया है।

सैक्टर 35 स्थित वुडस्टॉक इंडिया लिमिटेड कंपनी के डायरेक्टर रजनीश अरोड़ा ने पुलिस को दी शिकायत में बताया कि उनकी कंपनी चंडीगढ़ में एक घर खरीदना चाहती थी। मकान खरीदने के लिए उन्होंने मनमोहिनी

कक्कर से संपर्क किया। उन्होंने रजनीश अरोड़ा को सैक्टर 8 स्थित कोठी नं 121 दिखाई। कोठी का 30 प्रतिशत हिस्सा आईएएस सतीश कक्कर की पत्नी मनमोहिनी और 70 प्रतिशत हिस्सा उनकी बेटी शिवानी कक्कर के नाम था। उन्होंने कहा कि बैंक लोन उतारने के लिए वह कोठी बेच रहे हैं। रजनीश अरोड़ा को कोठी पसंद आ गई और छह जनवरी 2017 में 18 करोड़ रुपए में कोठी का सौदा तय हो गया। उनकी कंपनी ने एक करोड़ 80 लाख रुपए उन्हें दे दिए और कहा था कि 21 जनवरी 2017 से पहले चार करोड़

रुपए देकर 25 प्रतिशत डीडी कंपनी के नाम करवा देंगे और मकान का हिस्सा उन्हें सौंप देंगे। शिकायतकर्ता ने आरोप लगाया कि कोठी बेचने वाले अपने शर्त पर खरे नहीं उतारे और न ही कब्जा उन्हें दिया। उन्होंने मामले की शिकायत पुलिस को दी। सैक्टर 3 थाना पुलिस ने सैक्टर 8 निवासी रिटायर्ड आईएएस सतीश कुमार कक्कर, उनकी पत्नी मनमोहिनी कक्कर, उनकी बेटी शिवानी कक्कर और शिवानी के पति अजय कपूर पर धोखाधड़ी और आपराधिक साजिश के तहत मामला दर्ज कर लिया है।



Man arrested with country-made pistol

Chandigarh: The crime branch officials arrested a person with a country-made pistol and a cartridge from Sector 33 on Wednesday. The cops produced the accused in a local court, which sent him to a judicial custody.

The cops told that the accused has been identified as Gautam Sharma (26), a resident of Burali. The police seized one country-made pistol and one live cartridge from his possession.

Apparently, a team of crime branch laid a naka near the light point of Sector 33/45 to keep a check on anti-social elements in the area. "The accused was coming on foot from Sector 45. As he saw the naka, he turned around and tried to flee. We chased him down and during his search seized a country-made pistol and one cartridge," the cops said.

Following the incident, the cops arrested him under the Arms Act.

"During his interrogation, the accused revealed that he had brought the pistol from Uttar Pardesh. Accused wanted to sell the pistol and was looking for a buyer. Before he could make a move, he was arrested," the cops said. **TNN**

Man awarded 7-yr jail for minor's abduction, rape

A Mohali resident has been sentenced to seven-year imprisonment for raping a 16-year-old girl. The convict has also been directed to pay Rs 1.05 lakh as fine. Rs 1 lakh of the fine amount will go to the victim as compensation.

A case was registered against Ashu (28) was registered under Sections 341, 363, 376 and 506 of the IPC and Section 6 of the POCSO Act at the Sector 36 police station. However, he was held guilty under Sections 363 and 366 of the IPC and Section 4 of the POCSO Act.

On August 23, 2016, a woman had lodged a complaint that

her youngest daughter had been missing. She had left for a friend's place in Sector 20, Chandigarh, from her Mohali residence. She did not answer a call made on her mobile phone at 3 pm. The phone was later switched off.

The girl returned home at 9.30 pm and told her parents that their neighbour Ashu had met her in Sector 20. He forcibly took her to Rock Garden on his scooter. Later, he took her to a hotel in Sector 42 where she was made to consume a soft drink spiked with sedatives, following which she lost consciousness. She was then raped by Ashu.

Ashu was arrested after the girl's medical examination confirmed rape.



Man gets 7-year jail for raping 16-year-old

₹1.05 Lakh Fine Imposed Too

Chandigarh: The Chandigarh district court, on Thursday, awarded seven-year imprisonment to a 28-year-old man for abducting and raping a minor in 2016. The court of additional district and sessions judge Poonam R Joshi convicted him under sections 363 (abduction), 366 (abducting or inducing woman to compel her to marriage etc.) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and Section 4 of the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act. The court also imposed a fine of Rs 1.05 lakh on the convict.

According to police, the accused, Ashu, a resident of Mohali, was arrested in August,



2016, for raping a 16-year-old girl in a hotel in Attawa, Chandigarh. The complainant, a resident of Punjab, said her neighbour Ashu took her minor daughter to a hotel and raped her. On returning home, the girl narrated the incident to her mother.

Following this, the mother of the girl filed a formal complaint with local police. The police te-

am got the medical test conducted on the victim in a hospital where the doctors confirmed rape. Meanwhile, police arrested the accused Ashu under sections 376 (punishment for rape) and 506 (punishment for criminal intimidation) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC).

After the arguments, the court convicted him and sent him to seven years of jail.
