

Police distribute stickers to spread awareness about traffic rules

ON THE concluding day of the 29th National Road Safety Week-2018, the Chandigarh Police on Monday distributed 1,600 stickers with messages 'I will not honk', 'helmet saves her head too' and 'good driver' written on them. These stickers were affixed on the steering wheels of public vehicles throughout the city.

The road safety week started on April 23. As many as 1,200 stickers were of 'I will not honk', 200 stickers were of 'helmet saves her head too', and 200 were of 'good drivers'. The stickers which said 'helmet

saves her head too' were distributed among women two-wheeler riders.

The stickers were distributed and affixed on different locations by SSP (traffic) Shashank Anand and other traffic police personnel. Two hundred 200 stickers of 'good driver' were also affixed on the vehicles of those, who appeared to be driving their vehicles properly. Pamphlets regarding road safety were distributed among the public to make them aware of traffic rules and regulations.

The SSP (traffic) said, "As many as 1,200 stickers entitled 'I will not honk' were affixed on the steering wheels of public

vehicles, making them aware of the harm of blowing horn unnecessarily." The theme of this road safety week was "Sadak Suraksha-Jeevan Raksha".

Later, a function was held at Vivek High School, Sector 37, by the Chandigarh traffic police.

The road safety week was started with the introduction of 'towing away' vehicle app, which helped the public locate their towed away vehicles from the no-parking areas by Chandigarh traffic police, and 44 digital cameras called 'Divya Drishti', which are GPS-equipped. Through these cameras, police officers can see the functioning of at least 11 nakas on their cell phones, laptops and computer screens.



School buses should have seat belts: SSP

CHANDIGARH : UT senior superintendent of police (SSP) (security and traffic) Shashank Anand emphasised upon having fitted seat belts for students in school buses while addressing a gathering at Vivek High School on Monday. He said the school authorities should not allow any vehicle to blow horn around the school premises.

SSP suggested that parents and teachers should be motivated about car pooling. Students should be deployed for 15 minutes during the start and end of the day to manage traffic outside schools.

2018 at Vivek High School. The programme was organised under the theme 'Sadak Suraksha-Jeevan Raksha'. Deputy superintendent of police (DSP) (south) Rajeev Ambasta gave a presentation regarding the activities done by Chandigarh traffic police during the 29th National Road Safety Week.

Apart from this, 200 stickers of "Helmet saves her head too" were distributed to the female two-wheeler riders.
