

Love triangle claims man's life; police arrest accused

WASIM, A BROTHER OF DECEASED ALLEM, ALLEGED THAT HIS BROTHER'S WIFE HAS KILLED HIM.

Almost two days after a 32-year-old motor mechanic was kidnapped from the paddy market in Maloya, the Chandigarh Police on Friday arrested 31-year-old Khem Singh, alias Shanty, for murdering the motor mechanic by strangulating him. The deceased had been missing since Wednesday night.

Police officials said that the body of the deceased, identified as Mohammad Allem Ahmed, working at the Sector 48 Motor Market, Chandigarh, was recovered from Siswan, Haddi Road, Mullanpur. The body had cut marks on it.

"On Wednesday, as Ahmed was returning from his work, Shanty, along with his three friends, followed him from Sector 48 to paddy mandi in Sector 39. Then they stopped Allem's car. Shanty kept him busy talking, his friends dragged Allem out of the car and kidnapped him in their Innova

vehicle,” said DSP Harjit Kaur.

On Thursday at about 10 pm, under mysterious circumstances Allem's car was found abandoned near the paddy market in Maloya

Nitu had left **Allem for Shanty**

The police officials said that during interrogation, Shanty confessed that Nitu had left Allem three years back and was living with him but then for the past one and a half months she again went back to Allem which was disturbing him and because of which he planned to kill Allem.

Wasim, a brother of the deceased, alleged that his brother's lover Nitu Dogra, along with her accomplices, has killed Allem though till now the police have not confirmed involvement of Nitu.

Wasim told the police that on Wednesday Allem called him and shared that he had finished his work and was coming back home but Nitu had called him to Maloya citing some urgent work and that was the last time when he had talked to him last as after that his mobile phone got switched off.

"It was on Thursday when the police told me that the body of my brother has been recovered," said Wasim.

Wasim also alleged that his brother never got married to Nitu, while neighbours claimed that she is the wife of the deceased.

"Earlier also Nitu was in a live-in relationship with some other person for three months and the same person had helped Nitu to murder Allem," alleged Wasim.

with parking lights on. He was not inside the car. As Allem didn't come back, on Thursday Nitu, Allem's wife, lodged a complaint at the Maloya Police Station. On

Friday at around 5 am, the police recovered Allem's body at Siswan. Suspecting murder, the police questioned neighbours and family members.

Sweeper gets 1-yr jail for filming GMCH doctors in changing room

CHANDIGARH : A local court has awarded one year in prison to a sweeper at Government Medical College and Hospital, Sector 32, for filming doctors and nurses in the hospital's changing room.

The convict, Nirmal Singh, was held guilty under Sections 354B (assault or use of criminal force to woman with intent to disrobe), 354C (voyeurism) and

511 (attempting to commit offences punishable with imprisonment for life or other imprisonment) of the Indian Penal Code

Singh, employed as a safai karamchari at GMCH, was booked on May 30, 2015 on a complaint by the hospital administration, accusing him of using a mobile phone to film female staff in the changing room of the operation theatre on second floor of the hospital's Block C.

The complaint stated that a

doctor found a mobile phone concealed in a linen basket when she went to the room to change clothes. The phone's camera had been recording for two hours. Later, Singh confessed to the staff of having kept the phone there in recording mode, the complaint added.

Police interrogation found Singh was "fond of watching obscene pictures", and therefore, planted a mobile phone in the changing room of female staff.
