

Five held for stealing vehicles

Chandigarh: The police have nabbed two persons and three juveniles, who were involved in vehicle theft and burglary cases in the tricity, on Sunday.

The police said two teams, under the supervision of SHO Manimajra inspector Ranjit Singh headed by SI Vidya Nand, was constituted to nab the accused.

The police received information that the three accused were roaming near Indira Colony and were arrested from the spot.

During interrogation, it was found that the accused were juvenile and had stolen a car. Documents of the car have been recovered from their possession. They have been admitted to the juvenile home at Sector 25, Chandigarh.

ce were informed that two accused were roaming near the Shivalik Garden parking area. SI Vidya Nand reached the spot and arrested the two persons. They have been identified as Gopal alias Vicky, 23, and Basant Kumar, 18, both residents of Manimajra.

The police have recovered a zen car from their possession.

The police obtained re-

mand for the accused from the court for further interrogation. The accused disclosed that some days ago, along with their associates, they had broken the locks of five to six shops at Ram Darbar and stole articles and vehicles from the city.

With the arrest of the five accused, the police have recovered a total of Rs 6 lakh, said SHO Ranjit Singh.
