

Auto-rickshaw driver sets an example

Returns woman's purse containing jewellery worth ₹2 lakh, mobile

Setting an example of honesty, an auto driver today returned a woman's purse containing jewellery worth around Rs 2 lakh and other valuables, which was found at Mani Majra. The auto driver went to the police station after which the police contacted the woman, a government schoolteacher, to whom the purse belonged.

The police said Mohammad Sarif, a resident of Thakur Dwara Mandir, Mani Majra, was going for work in the morning when he noticed a woman's purse lying abandoned near his house.

Sarif checked the bag and found valuables, including gold and silver ornaments, a mobile phone, an ATM card, Rs 800 and important documents. The auto driver immediately went to the Mani Majra police station and handed over the purse to the police.

Police officials then traced the owner of the purse and informed her.

The woman visited the police station where her purse containing all her belongings was handed over to her.
